Guess which liquid will make a penny shine. 2. Set one penny aside. 3. Put each of the other two pennies into its own paper cup. 4. In one cup, pour enough vinegar to cover the penny. In the other cup, pour enough liquid soap to cover the other penny. 5. Wait at least ten minutes. 6. Remove the pennies, rinse them in water, and rub them with a paper towel. 7. Compare all three pennies.
